

CVC house is generated from the articulation of the garden's exterior spaces, terraces and the central patio with the spaces that were required by the client, as a way to generate a dialogue between the built space and the open space. In addition, there is a sequence of open spaces with varying degrees of intimacy, providing a gradual passage from the large space of the street to the green space at the back of the plot.


Inside a 3x3x3 grid, ten volumes are distributed around a central patio. This way, the project intertwines two units that can be inhabited independently.

A compact program within a porous massing gives the interior spaces optimal conditions of sunlight and views without compromising the privacy of its occupants and without reducing the open areas (patios and gardens).


