THE EXPRESSION OF SOUND

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The perfect acoustical space can only be created in collaboration. Even after an architect 'hands over the keys', so to speak, this process continues: how are world-class acoustics maintained when faced with the varied mixed-use programs of contemporary music venues? From the amphitheater to the shoe-box and the vineyard; performance space is defined not by the position of the stage, but of the audience. In November 2017, PLANE—SITE was invited to contribute to the World Architecture Festival. Our response was to create a multimedia, interactive panel drawing on our ongoing research into concert halls — beginning with Berlin's Pierre Boulez Saal in 2015.
